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Religious and Cultural Beliefs about Afterlife

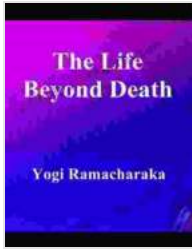

Spirituality often encompasses beliefs and practices that connect individuals to a realm beyond the physical world. In this context, the afterlife may be seen as:

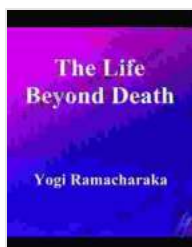
- **A Spiritual Realm:** A higher dimension or plane of existence where spirits or souls dwell.

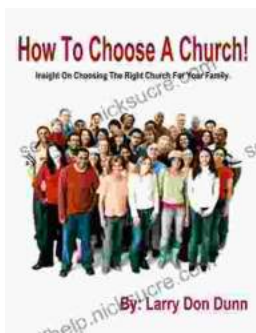


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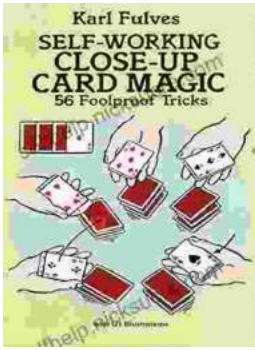
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
