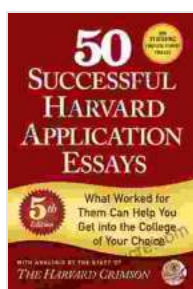

Apply to Multiple Colleges

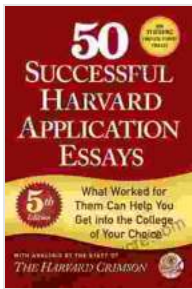

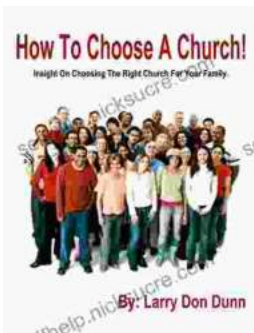
